Shred Day in Silver Lake

On Saturday April 23rd, we hosted our first Community Shred Day in Silver Lake. It was a windy and overcast day, but we were happy to help many customers get rid of their sensitive documents and files. We are looking forward to hosting more shred events like this in the future!

Why Shred?

Shredding old documents that contain sensitive information helps keep you safe so it doesn't wind up in the wrong hands. Criminals can use information from your documents to access even more of your personal information. They attempt to try and gather account details, credit card numbers, online passwords, SSN, birth dates,

and more. They may try to impersonate you by calling doctors offices, businesses you have made purchases from, or even contact your financial institutions. In most cases the criminals stealing your information will then sell it to other criminals. That is why it is important to shred your old documents to keep you safe!

MOSTACCIOLI SALAD

- 1 lb mostaccioli noodles, cooked
- 1 cup chopped onion
- 2 cups of cucumbers, cut up in small pieces
- 1 ½ cups vinegar
- chopped parsley
- 1 small jar of chopped pimento
- 1 1/2 cup sugar
- 1 tsp pepper
- 2 tsp yellow mustard
- 1 tsp accent
- 1 tsp garlic salt
- 1 tsp salt

1. Start by talking to your local banker. We are here to answer any and all of your questions about the home buying process. Ken, Crystal and Dena have been through this process numerous times and believe us when we tell you, there are no silly questions. Also, by working with local banks, we are able to work with local vendors that we already have relationships with for appraisals and title work. This will help the transaction go smoother versus using an online lending company who doesn't have a relationship with any of these vendors who are necessary in getting your new home purchased.

2. Make a budget. If this is your first home or if you're changing substantially in what your house payment will be, you'll want to be comfortable with the new payment. Often times, your lender can prequalify you for a payment that you may not be personally comfortable with and why Tip #1 is so important.

3. Know your credit. While talking to your local bank, you may take the time to get prequalified for a home loan. During this time, the lender may pull a copy of your credit report. It's important to know whether or not there are any derogatory or inaccurate information on your credit report that needs to be disputed or resolved before moving forward in the home buying process. You'll also want to refrain from taking out any additional debt until after you've purchased your home because it can change your qualification status. You may also check your credit once a year from all three credit bureaus for free at annualcreditreport.com.

4. Be prepared. When purchasing a home, lenders have to obtain a lot of information, specifically income and financial information. This can be overwhelming, however we as lenders are doing our due diligence. The sooner we can get this information from the borrower, the sooner we are able to make more accurate decisions regarding the loan.

5. Stay in touch with your lender. Unfortunately, there can be some hiccups when it comes to purchasing a

home. If something does come up, make sure your lender is aware of it. Most of the time, the real estate agent will be in contact with them, but sometimes communication gets lost.

Recognizing and Avoiding Scams

Con artists cheat Americans out of billions of dollars every year. Recognizing red flags for potential scams can help protect you, your loved ones, and your hard earned cash.

Phishing

Phishing is when scammers pretend to be someone that they aren't

to gather sensitive information or access to a person's funds through a credit card or bank account. Phishing can take many forms, including emails, texts, and even fake websites. Often, you'll get an email or text informing you that there's been a problem with your account or offering you a great deal from a company you know and trust.

Do not click on these links or enter your information. Navigate to a separate browser or even use a different device to go to the official website and review your account or check out the offer. Do not enter any of your information into a pop up or when prompted by an email.

Threatening Impersonations

Similar to phishing, scammers can also try to intimidate you into paying them by pretending to be a person in power. That could mean impersonating someone from the IRS, a debt collector, or anyone who demands you pay them immediately.

The IRS will never call you and ask you to pay. If you get a call claiming someone is from the IRS, hang up, and reach out to an official IRS channel to confirm if there is really a problem. You can find ways to contact the IRS at IRS.gov. When it comes to debt collection, you don't have to take the person at their word either. You can research the collector and send a Debt Validation Letter.
